On Wednesday, September 27 several branch members attended the panel discussion on "Fake News" which our branch co-sponsored with the League of Women Voters. The speakers were Dr. Jim Caccamo, St. Joseph's University Associate Professor of Theology, whose teaching emphasizes Christian social ethics, Dr. Michael Boyle, West Chester University Professor of Communications whose teaching reflects how news media present issues to the public, and our own branch member, Anne Mosakowski, Instructional Technology Specialist and conducts online technology courses for educators. Dr. Caccamo started the discussion by defining "news" and its origins, how "fake news" is false information caused by obfuscation. He summarized by saying "we need accurate data (facts) to be a good society, with communication brings respect." Dr. Boyle's slant to the topic was to use the analogy "Food vs. Media" that there is good and bad in each and decisions made about each of these can be emotionally charged. He focused on "information overload", how this 'overload' makes us take shortcuts in understanding and relating information we have been given, and lastly, how our biases govern how we "listen" to news. Anne's approach to the night's topic was through educators' eyes. We must learn what sites are legitimate news sites versus those that are not and how to recognize fake news story on the internet. Anne introduced her Wiki page that she uses with educators that take her online courses.
